

Glen Taylor School (1289)

Enrolment Scheme

Effective from Term 1 2022

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under Schedule 20 section 4 of the Education and Training Act 2020 (formerly section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989) for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below and/or shown on the attached map shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Starting at the intersection of St Heliers Bay Road and West Tamaki Road, travel east along West Tamaki Road (even addresses included only until Line Road; Emerson Street, Florida Place, Modena Crescent excluded). At Line Road (even addresses 18 and below only included), travel south until traveling east at Farrington Road (28, 29 and above included). Travel southwest along the walkway to the end of Delemere Place and along Delemere Place (odd addresses 3-11 and even address 14 included) until Epping Street. Travel south along Epping Street (even addresses 20-48 included) and then south along Heatherbank Street (odd addresses 39-49 excluded). At Taniwha Street (141-167 odd addresses included), turn east until Elstree Avenue, at which point head north along Elstree Avenue (odd addresses 85-87 and 51 and below included, Chiltern Crescent odd addresses and Leaside Lane also included) until Linthorpe Crescent. Turn east along Linthorpe Crescent (even addresses included) and then northwest along Leybourne Circle (140-154 and 4-52 even addresses, 131-137 and 1-51 odd addresses included). Roseway Place 4-8 even addresses and Ridgeway Place 1-19 odd and 4-6 even addresses included). At Courtland Avenue travel north (odd addresses included) until West Tamaki Road. Travel west along West Tamaki Road (odd addresses only until Crossfield Road), and then north along Crossfield Road (odd addresses only until Mt Taylor Drive). Travel west along Mt Taylor Drive (excluded) and the southwest along Esperance Road (excluded) until Ashby Avenue (69 and above odd addresses included, 62 and above even addresses included). Travel south along Ashby Avenue, until West Tamaki Road, at which point return to origin.

All no exit roads within the boundaries described above are included in the zone unless otherwise stated.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Second Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

Third Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.

Fourth Priority will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.

Fifth Priority will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.

Sixth Priority will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Schedule 20 section 4 of the Education and Training Act 2020 (formerly section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989). Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
